APGO EDUCATION FOUNDATION ANNOUNCES \$3,200 GRANT TO ARKONA LIONS MUSEUM AND INFORMATION CENTRE FOR MICROSCOPE AND DISPLAY EQUIPMENT

March 15, 2021, Toronto, Ontario: The APGO Education Foundation ("the Foundation") is pleased to announce that it has granted \$3,200 to the Arkona Lions Museum and Information Centre in Arkona approximately 50km west of London, Ontario. The Arkona museum houses an excellent collection of well-preserved fossils from the Arkona area, such as crinoids, brachiopods, corals and trilobites, and includes samples from the privately-owned nearby Hungry Hollow fossil pit. These funds will used to purchase an Olympus Trinocular Stereo Microscope and 4K LCD display screen to be used for educational purposes at the museum.

The stereo binocular microscope will allow visitors to explore the fascinating world of fossils and especially microfossils at Arkona. Visitors to the museum will be able to manipulate the focus and magnification so that they can explore microscope slides of the remarkable range of fossils at the site. The microscope will have a camera that is connected to a wall-mounted 4K LCD screen to enhance viewing.

In addition to public viewing, the microscope and LCD screen will be used as an educational tool by museum workers and visiting experts to show visitors and students the wide array of fossil characteristics. Visitors will learn about sea life in the Devonian Period and view microfossils that they might not otherwise see, such as conodont teeth which are widespread at Arkona but can only be seen under a microscope.

Chair of the Foundation commented: "We are delighted to support the fine work of the Arkona Museum in promoting awareness of the amazing geological history of the Arkona area. Visitors will be able to better learn about the Devonian Period in Ontario and the many creatures of all sizes and shapes that lived in the seas at that time".

Museum curator and local fossil expert Bob O'Donnell adds "This generous grant will allow us to bring forth a whole new world in microfossils for everyone to see and learn about, using modern technology."
